European Regulation (EC) 1272/2008 Classification Labelling and Packaging of substances and mixtures (CLP Regulation) and CMR

The CLP Regulation creates a Classification and Labelling Inventory. The Inventory is populated using classifications determined by the chemicals industry.

Much of the information will be submitted as part of the suppliers' REACH registration for those substances that are placed on the market.

The CLP Regulation ensures that the hazards presented by chemicals are clearly communicated to users and consumers in the European Union through classification and labelling of chemicals.

Before placing chemicals on the market, the chemicals industry have to establish the potential risks to human health and the environment of such substances and mixtures, classifying them in line with the identified hazards. The hazardous chemicals also have to be labelled according to a standardised system so that users and consumers know about their effects before they handle them.

The hazards associated with chemicals are communicated through labels and safety data sheets.

The Regulation replaces over time two previous pieces of legislation, the Dangerous Substances Directive and the Dangerous Preparations Directive.

There are no actions required by Glenair to label our products or to provide safety data sheets in accordance with CLP

Carcinogenic, Mutagenic and Reprotoxic Substances

The classification of CMRs in the EU is based on the strength of evidence showing that they present one of the CMR types of hazards and risks to human health.

The new EU legislation regarding Classification Labelling and Packaging of substances – the CLP Regulation 1272/2008 – uses the hazard categories for substances and for mixtures that contain any or all 3 CMRs.

To put this into perspective over 30 million tons of CMRs are produced in Europe yearly.

Glenair does not use any CMR's and as such will not be present in any of our product range unless otherwise requested e.g. in a customer defined product.

This statement is periodically reviewed to ensure that it remains as accurate as it can be.
